Pleasantville was originally an "outstation" of the Bridgewater Baptist Church

Jan 16, 1869	At a meeting held at Pleasantville School: "It was unanimously resolved that a house of worship in this section is absolutely indispensable. " --building committee established: Deacon Alexander Corkum, Elias Corkum, and J.W. Falt
	--at a subsequent meeting (date unknown) – meetinghouse site was chosen and Trustees named: Deacon Alexander Corkum, Jacob Corkum, and Deacon Benjamin Sarty
Nov 25, 1872	--Building Committee reports "that the meeting house is now ready for opening ; and we wish to hand it over to the Trustees of the House, for the church to sell the pews, and pay the building committee."
Nov 27, 1872	Pews (a family's seating in the church) were sold --48 pews were sold in total, with 2 designated as a "free seat" --pew purchase prices ranged from \$59 to \$20 --total cost of building meeting house: \$1338.59 --total raised from selling of the pews: \$1433.00
Dec 15, 1872	Pleasantville Meeting House opened for services --10 ½ o'clock service: Rev. Stephen March of Bridgewater, on Isaiah 56:7 --2 ½ o'clock service: Rev. William E. Hall, on 1 Chronicles 29:5 --also held a 7 pm service
	" Services were held with almost uninterrupted regularity, every other Sabbath, or twice a month..." --congregation grew, saw many saved and become members --regular monthly conferences also held, usually on the Saturday before second service of the month, which were a combination of bible message/service, followed by a business meeting (if anything urgent needed to be dealt with)
October 1874	--Rev. Stephen March ends his pastorate --Rev. John Williams and Rev. A.J. Cogswell become joint Pastors of Bridgewater Church and its "outstations"
-----, 1875	"By mutual consent of the Bridgewater Church and Pleasantville section, after due deliberation by a competent council called for that purpose, the latter was organized into a separate church to be known and distinguished as "The Pleasantville Baptist Church..."
Spring 1876	The church negotiates with Rev. F.D. Crawley of Acadia College to minister at the church for a few months after the school closes in June. This arrangement worked out so well, that it was decided to ordain him as their minister
Sept 22, 1876	Ordination of Rev. Frederick D. Crowley

October 20, 1876	--"...resolved that we secure the labour of Rev. F.D. Crawley for the next six months."
October 28, 1876	At a meeting of the pewholders, it was agreed to transfer remaining funds left over after roof repairs towards the building of a parsonage
June 1877	Rev. Crawley resigns after accepting "a call to labor with the church at Sydney, C.B."
1877-1886	((Pastor(s) name unknown at present))
September 1887	S. March was pastor at this time, at least since September 1886 (perhaps longer)
October 21, 1887	First mention in the church record book of Sabbath School: Benjamin Sarty appointed as Superintendent, Nathan Lantz as assistant Superintendent; school to be opened "next Sabbath at 9 am"
October 19, 1889	Trustees appointed for New Cumberland Section Meeting House: Jacob Misner, Stephen Misner, Mickel Corkum
Feb 26, 1893	Bro. J.W. Brown asked to serve as Pastor --"Terms of Preaching: first Sunday of the month in the afternoon 2 ½ o'clock third Sunday of the month in the morning 10 ½ o'clock conference meeting Saturday before the 3 Sunday afternoon 2 ½ o'clock"
Jan 27, 1895	--"resolve to build a barn 18 feet long 10 feet broad..."
October 26, 1895	Bro. S. March to preach 3 rd Sunday of Nov. and Dec.: \$4.00 per sermon
Jan 1, 1896	"each male member to pay a rate of \$1.00 for the [building of the] horse shed"
March 30, 1896	Rev. D.W. Crandall to be pastor of both Pleasantville and New Canada Baptist Churches --"every second Sunday of the month in the morning and our usual conference meeting" --"no certain amount of money mentioned for his salary we are to do for him the best we can."
August 8, 1896	--moved to sell a parcel of ground belonging to the church for \$26.00
April 3, 1897	--busy conference meeting -- 5 new members "received for baptism and church member."

October 30, 1897	Rev. Churchill the pastor now?
Nov 20, 1897	First mention of church organ: "Jacob B. Sarty to pay Benjamin L. Sarty of church funds the sum of \$6.00 for rent of organ"
January 1, 1898	First mention of women's groups: "the meeting house to be opened and warmed once a month for Woman's Aid Society"
May 29, 1898	"Rev. Bro. J.E. Bleakney commencing service with Pleasantville Church." --this arrangement included Pleasantville, Dayspring, and services for subscribers in New Cumberland and Conquerall Bank --Home Mission Board to be contacted for a grant to supplement pastor's income
March 7, 1900	successful drive to collect money to pay off money owing on organ
April 13, 1901	resolved to continue with arrangement with Rev. J.E. Bleakney to preach at Pleasantville and Dayspring and their branches
Nov 10, 1901	records make mention of going "by the river side" for baptism
Jan 1, 1902	"resolved to take up a collection every Sunday morning and evening"
Dec 9, 1905	7 members taken off the church book for "forsaking the Baptist Church and uniting with the Plimith (sp) Brethren." (one was a former deacon)
April 7, 1906	Pastor Bleakney resigns (from 1902 to this point, it looks like Pastor Bleakney just serves in Pleasantville, there is no mention of continuing the agreement with Dayspring in church records)
June 9 1906	Rev. W.E. Carpenter begins
February 6, 1907	" moved, second and carried the money made by the Pleasantville Bean Supper shall be deposited by the 3 Deacons of the Church until the church calls for the use of it."
June 4, 1907	Rev. Carpenter renews his service
August 28, 1907	--"...reading of a letter from Bro. Carpenter asking again to return and to renew his engagement with Pleasantville Church we Brethren resolved unanimously he should continue steadfast with the church he is engaged for the present year."
October 12, 1907	Rev. J.T. Irvine (or Ervin) begins
Dec 14, 1908	Benjamin L. Sarty resigns as Clerk after 21 years of service, A.C. Corkum appointed as new clerk
January 9,	First mention of an organist: Miss Florence Richard (motion to give her a gift for her service)

September 12, 1909	Pastor Irvine resigns
Oct 18, 1909	Rev. Morrison considered for pastor (begins in Nov? Dec?)
June 11, 1910	--resolved to consult with Dayspring to see "if they were willing to hire L.G. (or L.C.) Loomer as Pastor for the field."
August 22, 1910	--voted to hire Rev. G.L. Bishop as pastor of the field
November 12, 1910	\$20.35 was collected in the community to thank Rev. Blakney for his service rendered during the summer
April 9, 1911	Rev. Bishop resigns
May 13, 1911	Rev. G. W. Collins asked to visit the field on trial
June 15, 1911	church wishes to hire G.W. Collins "as Pastor for the field", for a year starting June 25
March 19, 1912	church wishes to hire pastor for another year "if the rest of the field be willing" for a slightly smaller salary for same amount of preaching as before
February 17, 1913	--(Rev. G.W. Collins still pastor) --committee appointed to determine buying of a building for a parsonage
October 25, 1913	-"it was agreed to hire Bro. Spurgen Hirtle if satisfactory to Dayspring Baptist Church"
November 24, 1913	--Pastor S.M. Hirtle agrees to serve --hay from parsonage grounds to be sold \$14 per ton
February 15, 1914	--ladies of the Sewing Circle present \$93.00 to the church; voted to put it towards debt of parsonage --additional notation under this entry in the records indicate \$47.29 was raised by a garden party and put towards parsonage debt
May 9, 1915	Mrs. Leroy Lantz resigns as organist; Miss Myrtle Corkum new organist, Miss Birtha Haughn assistant
July 28, 1915	--moved that Rev. J.H. Copland continues as Pastor for Pleasantville and New Cumberland --\$275 per annum, 3 months notice required from both sides if termination wanted --he gives a report for the past year, hence there since 1914?

History of Brookfield Baptist Church

In 1867 Samuel and Ceretha Smith sold a piece of Land explicitly for the purpose of building and maintaining a building whereby worship services could be held and the Board of Trustees would be responsible for the structure of said building. Although this was decided to a denomination known as the Wesleyan Methodists, ministers of other recognized faiths could also hold services there. Reportedly, work on the foundation commenced at once and the building was put up and the roof shingled before winter set in. Delays appear to have been encountered, but Richard Hunt is credited with the pushing the project to completion.

The Church was officially opened 6 October 1872 with three services: Rev. E. B. Moore preached the morning service; Rev. S. Sykes the afternoon service and Rev. W. Jones of Liverpool the evening service. On the following day the pews were sold; the sum of \$1650 was realized with the proceeds from a tea and sale by the woman, the whole of the debt incurred was paid.

1887. This may have been when the balcony was removed, and the roof rebuilt at a steeper pitch. (The original rafters are still there). The Harlow diary tells:

June 14 1887- Rufus Carder is at work on the meeting House putting on the tower

June 15- a lot of people on the Church today shingling.

July 15- A crowd of people are today tearing out the inside of the Meeting House.

Aug 5- McPherson assessing pews today for the Church repairs.

Oct 2- Our Church was rededicated today after being repaired this past summer. First service today.

Feb 28, 1888 Had meeting today to sell pews.

June 1, 1890- They have just put up four nice chandeliers in the Church.

Nov 21, 1910- There was a presentation service for the bell

One account says that the families living on the Old Annapolis Road formed a sewing circle and raised money for the Church bell. Since that time a furnace room has been added at the back of the building, and minor rearrangements made inside, but the basic structure remains the same. In fact, on a cold winter morning, one can still perceive the large high ceiling-ed sanctuary as a barn-like edifice.

The Orange Hall

The present hall was built at Brookfield Mines by the Orange Lodge- a fraternal organization somewhat similar to the Masons. It was totally Protestant, and strongly against intoxicating beverages. For these reasons when the hall was moved to north Brookfield it had to become church property and remain so.

History of the Mahone Bay United Baptist Churches

On June 2nd of 1907 following the Sunday service 152 members who comprised the Mahone Bay Church requested their letters of dismissal in order to form the Mahone Bay United Baptist Church. The baptist began holding regular services in Mahone Bay as early as 1833 when they used the Union Meeting House which had been built as a cooperative undertaking by the Methodist, Presbyterians, Lutherans, and Baptist. When the building became too small, services were held in a hall owned by Joseph Hamm located on the South Main Street.

The existing Church building was erected in 1874-1875 and was dedicated on March 14, 1875. Rev. E. M. Saunders, one of the better known historians of the denominations, preached the dedication sermon.

In 1911, during the pastorate of Rev. B. D. Knott, the present Church Hall was added to provide facilities for the Sunday School which was organized in 1860.

In 1975 the Church celebrated the 100th Anniversary of the building of the Church.

Brief Historic Highlights of the Baptist Church in Bridgewater

The 'Lord's Barn' was officially opened as the Baptist Meeting House in 1854.

The 'Lord's Barn' was purchased and the deeds registered June 4, 1855.

In 1915 Rev. Frank Eaton placed before the congregation a proposal for a new church building.

On January 16, 1920, the church voted to proceed with the construction of a new church building.

On January 30, 1921, the Bridgewater Baptist Church was formally opened on King Street, Bridgewater.

Perley Tidd

Perley served in a number during his ministry. He served in New Canada N. S. for 3 years; Pubnico N. S; Tracey Mills, N. B; Port Lorne, N. S; Springfield, N. S; Barrington, N. S; Tremont, N. S; Forest, Ontario, Porthawkesbury, N. S; Minto, N. B; Black's Harbour, N. B; Clementsvale N. S; Berry Mills and Steeves Mountain, N. B; St. Margaret's Bay, N. S; New Canada, N. S (10 Years); Port Mouton N. S. In all he served 11 pastorials in Nova Scotia, 4 in New Brunswick and 1 in Ontario. 16 in 60 years 5 months.

Doug Porter

Doug was converted to Christianity in 1950. He was married on May 31st 1959. He graduated from Grade 12 at Bethany Bible College Yarmouth NS in 1957. In 1968 he received (B. Th.) from Acadia Divinity Collage, Wolfville NS. He also received courses from Gordon College, Wenham Mass. Boston University Boston Mass. Eastern Nazarene College, Quincy, Mass. Rutgers University, New Brunswick, New Jersey; Acadia University, Wolfville NS.

He served for the summer of 1959 as supply Pastor at Temple Baptist Church, Yarmouth, NS. He served as youth worker at White Street Baptist Church, East Boston Mass, from 1959 to 1960. from 1960 to 1962 he worked in Christian Education at Central Baptist Church, Quincy Mass. From 1963 to 1969 he served as pastor of Westchester Baptist 4 Church field, Westchester, NS. He served as pastor of the Dorchester Baptist Church, Dorchester, NB from 1969 to 1970. From 1971 to 1972 he was the executive Director of the Nova Scotia Federation on Alcohol and

other Drug Problems from Dartmouth, NS. From 1972 to 1975 he served as pastor of Stevens Road Baptist Church Dartmouth, NS. During that time two new churches were started as a result of outreach works. (Regal Road and Immanuel). From 1975 to 1982 he pastored at the Aylesford Baptist Pastorate. In 1977 they brought in a second pastor and Morrystown Baptist which was historically part of the Aylesford Pastorate which became its own field, building their own parsonage. The same year Aylesford Church added a \$85,000.00 addition to their church. From 1982 to 1988 he pastored the Coldbrook Baptist Church. From 1988 to 2002 was the pastor of the Pleasantville Baptist Church. From 2002 to 2005 he pastored the Milton Baptist 3 point pastorate. In 2005 he went to pastor the New Cornwall. He stayed there until 2008. during that time the church went from services every other Sunday to services every Sunday by Dec of 2005. Attendance doubled and a large bible study met regularly. His wife and him visited over 400 homes in a community wide visitation. From 2009 to 2010 he did supply work for churches especially Bars Corner/ Parkdale Maplewood. From 2011 to 2012 he served as ½ time interim Pastor of the Morrystown Baptist Church. From July 7th 2013 to April 6th 2014 he was the interim Pastor of Aenon and Western Shore Baptist Churches. From April 20th 2014 to January 2017 was interim Pastor of the New Ross/ Forties Baptist Churches.

Rev Doctor Dan Green

He was the assistant Pastor of Calvary baptist Church, Moncton, New Brunswick from 1980 to 1981. He then went to Calvary baptist Church Oakhill Nova Scotia and Pastored there from 1981 to 1987. from 1987 to 1990 he was the Pastor of the Blanford Baptist Church. He then went to the Amherst Baptist Church.

Rev Lloyd Gillie Ordained September 1986

Lloyd started his service at the Ohio United Baptist Church in the Yarmouth Association From January 1982 to January 1983. from February 1983 to July 1985 he served at the Shediac, Calhoun United Baptist Church, Westmorland, Kent association New Brunswick. From there he went to the Kemptville United Baptist, Yarmouth Association from July 1985 to September 1990. at that time he also served at the Cannan Free Will Baptist Church, Yarmouth County from July 1985 to August 1990. He then went to Valley, Albert Mines, Westmorland, Kent association New Brunswick from September 1990 to November 1991. then he went to Cedar, Lake Baptist Church, Yarmouth Association from December 1992 to September 1995. He then went to the New Cornwall Baptist Church in Lunenburg/ Queens association from March 2000 to October 2006. At that time he also served Lapland Baptist Church from June 2000 to March 2009. He then went to the Indian Point Union Church from May 2003 to February 2016. During that time he served in Northwest Baptist Church from January 2004 to December 2004; Bridgewater Baptist Church as visitation Pastor in 2007; Northwest Baptist Church from March 2007 to July 2007; Zion United, Liverpool, August 2010

to Sept 2010; North Brookfield, South Brookfield, Westfield Baptist Churches, from October 2007 to June 2010; Parkdale Maplewood, Barss Corner Baptist Churches from July 2010 to August 2011; Caledonia, Kempt, Maitland Bridge United Churches from April 2012 to December 2012; Zion United, Liverpool January 2013 to April 2013 and then from June 2013 to August 20th 2017 he served at the Springfield, East Dalhousie United Baptist Churches.

She moved with her family to Ontario where she completed High School and graduated from Carleton University. During her teaching career, she became a Reading Specialist receiving her Master of Education in Reading. Following her retirement from the Halifax Regional School Board in 1998, Rev. Riley returned to study and graduated from Acadia Divinity College in Wolfville, Nova Scotia, with her Master of Divinity Degree and was ordained in November of that year.

In the fall of 2003, Rev. Riley accepted a call to ministry with the Victoria Road Baptist Church, Dartmouth, Nova Scotia and in September 2008 she began her ministry in Mahone Bay. Rev. Riley is actively involved in the work of the Convention of Atlantic Baptist Churches serving on numerous committees and boards. She has held various positions in the African United Baptist Association, serving as chair of the Historical records Committee and a member of the Trustees of the Acadia Divinity Collage.
